Week 3: Neon Sign #3 — God Can Always Do The Impossible

Who are some people you want to be like? Who are some people you don't want to be like?

Grow

1. Recap **Joshua 3:8-17**, the story of crossing the Jordan river and **Joshua 6:1-5, 15-21**, the story of conquering Jericho. What are the specific promises God makes to Joshua and the Israelites in these stories?
2. What would it have been like to have been there and experience those miracles? How would it have impacted your faith?
3. The trend throughout the book of Joshua is God moves after the people move. When they put their feet in, God stops the water. When they march around the city, God brings the walls down. Are you waiting on God to do something but neglecting something He's asked *you* to do? Why do you think we still hesitate when God tells us to move?
4. What feels impossible in your world right now? (*My spouse will never change; I'll never be financially stable; I'll never overcome my addictions; There's no way they'll ever believe, etc*).
5. Jon gave us two very practical action steps. How do you feel God calling you to put these into practice in your life?
 - a. Obey (**Joshua 1:7-8**) - not to get God to do something, but because we love Him
 - b. Pray (**Joshua 10:12-13**) - pray expectantly and full of faith
6. Is it hard for you to believe that God still works miracles? Are you ever afraid to ask for the impossible?
7. What are you asking for right now that requires faith from you and power from Him?

Pray

Adopt **Mark 9:24** as your prayer this week, "I do believe, but help me in my unbelief". Ask God to help you see His faithfulness, His goodness, and His power more and more clearly each day. Quit praying small prayers, and pray big!

Next

It's easy to agree with the statement, "God is faithful," but take some time to actually list out where you have seen Him be faithful in your own life. Think through the promises He's made and the prayers He's answered. Praise Him for that.
