2. Have you ever been offended when a Millennial asked you a question? Share more about that experience.
3. **Read 1 Timothy 4:12.** We need to move from *"criticizing to challenging,"* because, *"criticizing points to problems, challenging calls to solutions."* Where do you sense Jesus challenging you to be more solution-oriented in your life, family, or work?
4. In which area could you set a better example: speech, conduct, love, faith or purity? How?
5. Scott said, "Pursuing simplicity will open up more opportunity to demonstrate your love, and for you to rest." Where does your life need greater simplicity? What would your life look like with the margin created by this kind of focus on simplifying?
6. *"Love always involves sacrifice."* What is one thing you could sacrifice this week, to show the person you love the most just how significant they are to you?
7. Purity, especially in the context of sexual purity, is an issue in which every generation could set a better example. How can your Southland Group hold you more accountable to pursue purity?
