### Week 3: A Humble Donkey

#### Connect

If you were making a “grand” appearance somewhere and had to ride in on an animal, what would you choose? Why?

#### Grow

##### Read Matthew 21:1-11

1. Read **Zechariah 9:9**. Why did Jesus ride into Jerusalem on a donkey of all animals? What does this teach us about His Kingdom?
2. Read **Mark 11:11** and **Matthew 21:11-13**. What does Jesus do after entering town on a donkey? What do we learn about Jesus when He clears the temple?
3. Share about the last time you were angry. Was it “righteous” anger? What are some of the “wrong” things that draw your anger? What are some “right” things that draw your anger?
4. Jesus could have addressed oppression by the Roman government and other external circumstances the Jews faced culturally and politically. Instead, He focuses on what’s going on inside the Temple. What are some circumstances and situations that keep you from addressing what’s going on inside your heart?
5. Scott said, “Jesus is very disruptive.” How was He disruptive in the Temple? How has He been disruptive in your life?
6. Read **1 Corinthians 8:1**. Why is knowledge alone dangerous? Are you more drawn to knowledge or love? How can you live a better balance between knowledge and love in your life?

#### Pray

Read **Psalms 139:23-24**. Pray that each person in the group would be open to whatever work the Holy Spirit wants to do in your hearts. Ask Him to take everyone’s eyes off what’s going on “out there” (external events) to focus on what’s going on “in here” (the heart).
