

Slaying Dragons: Week 3 — "Lust"

CONNECT: What is the snack food you cannot stop eating if it's available?

GROW:

- 1. Lust may be the most uncomfortable "dragon" to talk about in the church, but not in the world. Why is this an issue we as a church must talk about and teach on regularly?
- 2. **Read Matthew 5:27-29.** Jesus believes battling lust requires serious action. What actions should we take if lust is a sin we struggle with?
- 3. **Read 1 Corinthians 6:18-20.** Scott said in his sermon, "In the church, we are mutually responsible for one another." What does that look like in regard to lust?
 - a. Men, how should this affect the way you interact with women?
 - b. Women, how should this affect the way you interact with men?

4. Read 1 Corinthians 7:1-9.

- a. Married people: How should this shape intimacy in the marriage? *Note for discussion: This is not a verse to be used to convince your spouse of anything, but rather a truth given as a way to love your spouse. This should not be a weapon to get more sex!*
- b. Singleness: It's clear that Paul esteemed singleness. We ought to do so as well!
 - i. Single people: What does it look like for you to serve others and honor God?In what ways is it easier and also more difficult to do that as a single person?
 - ii. Married people: How are you serving our single people in the church? How are you learning from them and letting them serve you?

PRAY: Read 1 John 1:9 and 1 Corinthians 10:13. Pray for healing and confession amongst your group and their families/circles. Pray for our church, that we may be a shining light of hope to the world through the healing of sexual sin that God provides.
